WHAT IT IS

A COURSE THAT TURNS RESPONDERS INTO INSTRUCTORS

The Street Medicine Instructor Course prepares public safety professionals to teach Tactical Emergency Casualty Care within their own organizations. It was built on a simple premise: the people on scene in the first minutes of an active violence incident or catastrophic injury are almost never paramedics — they are officers, deputies, firefighters, security staff, and range instructors. Training all of them is only affordable if agencies can teach their own.

Trilogy EMS launched the course in 2016 and has delivered it across the United States. More than 450 law enforcement officers and paramedics have been trained as Street Medicine Instructors. Trilogy staff instructors are paramedics and TCCC/TECC instructors.

WHY IT EXISTS

THE PROBLEM

- Every public safety officer — not only tactical officers — encounters gunshot wounds, stabbings, accidents, and other severe trauma.
- TCCC bleeding-control concepts are proven to work.
- Agencies that own their instructor cadre control their own training, reach all personnel, and cut cost.

WHY MINUTES MATTER

TIME TO DEATH

Arterial bleeding	2-4 min
Airway compromise	4-6 min
Tension pneumothorax	>10 min

Hemorrhage, airway and ventilatory compromise, and tension pneumothorax are the leading causes of preventable death in tactical situations.

CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

THREE PHASES OF CARE

TECC organizes care by the threat environment. Instructors are trained to teach all three phases.

DIRECT THREAT

CARE UNDER FIRE

Hot Zone

- Mitigate the threat
- Controlling bleeding
- Rescue and self-care
- Drags and carries

INDIRECT THREAT

STREET CARE

Warm Zone

- Patient assessment
- Controlling bleeding
- Basic airway management

EVACUATION

EVACUATION

Cold Zone

- Package the patient
- Transfer to a higher level of care

SKILLS

WHAT YOU ARE CERTIFIED TO TEACH

First responder-level skills that work and that buy time.

TOURNIQUETS

C-A-T application to arm and leg; early use for life-threatening extremity bleeding.

AIRWAY MANAGEMENT

Head tilt-chin lift, jaw thrust, nasopharyngeal airway, ventilations.

PATIENT ASSESSMENT

Scene safety, 360-degree awareness, abolish threats, CAB and MARCH.

HEMOSTATIC & WOUND PACKING

Junctional wounds — neck, axilla, groin. Direct pressure with topical hemostatic packing.

DRAGS & CARRIES

One- and two-person drags, carries, and stretcher drags under threat.

INSTRUCTOR DEVELOPMENT

Adult learning principles, classroom presentation, practical skills instruction, scenario-based training.

THE CREDENTIAL

HOW THE INSTRUCTOR PATHWAY WORKS

- You do not need to be an EMT or paramedic to become a TECC instructor.
- No contract or ongoing agreement with Trilogy EMS is required.
- You sign a curriculum agreement directly with C-TECC.
- You then deliver TECC courses in accordance with the C-TECC Guidelines.

C-TECC was formed in 2010 as a 501(c)(3) and is modeled after the military's CoTCCC, widely credited with producing the lowest combat mortality rates in recorded history. Trilogy EMS moved the course from NAEMT to C-TECC in 2020.

SCOPE — READ THIS BEFORE YOU ENROLL

THIS COURSE IS

- Active Bystander and First Responder level.
- Focused on lifesaving interventions within that scope.
- Designed so any public safety professional can instruct.

Advanced care is deferred to EMS. What you may teach is governed by your instructor authorization; what you may practice is governed by your license and medical director.

THIS COURSE IS NOT

- A comprehensive tactical operators course.
- A course that certifies you as a Tactical Medic.
- A Rescue Task Force course.
